TWO TYPES OF 4+1 PROGRAMS



<u>4+1</u>

- Declare with undergrad major
- 4+1 academic advisor
- Take 2-3 grad courses as an undergrad
- Grad courses double count for undergrad and grad degree
- Meet same admission standards to enter into +1 year
- No commitment to stay or continue in program

<u>Advanced Standing</u>

- Qualify with undergrad major
- Do not need to declare
- Do not take grad courses as an undergrad
- Begin program after undergraduate graduation



4+1 STATS

- 910 students in the undergraduate majors listed below, about 340 (or 37%) are declared 4+1 majors:
 - Accounting
 - Bioinformatics
 - Computer Science
 - Data Science
 - Elementary Education
 - Mathematics
 - Music
- 935 UG business majors qualify for the MBA Advanced Standing program
- 190 BSW majors that qualify for the MSW Advanced Standing program
- In Fall '23, **119** freshmen 4+1 declared majors
- In Fall '24, **142** freshmen 4+1 declared majors
- 15% increase year over year
