

- They provide guidance in areas of academic, personal and social development.



STEM Center


- Walk-in tutoring and tutoring by appointment in many of the 1st and 2nd year courses for the following majors:

Ramapo Exploration Program (REP)





Helps undeclared students make informed decisions about major (& minor) declaration to find connection to a discipline and an academic home at the College.

- Explore majors through 10 General Education (Gen Ed) courses

Fall 2024 Courses (16 credits):

- 1. First-Year Seminar (picked today): INTD
- 2. Critical Reading and Writing: CKWT 101 or 102
- 3. Math: MATH 022, 024, 104, 108, etc.
- 4. General Education or Major Course: (SOCI, HIST, BIOL, etc.)

Notes:

- College Catalog/My Graduation Plans help with course planning.
 12-18 credits is full-time status. Less may impact financial aid.
- 128 credits are required for graduation.

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


