- Distribution Category (Culture & Creativity: (*Consider LITR 220, 221, 224, 244, 245, 280, 284, 292, 293, 295, or 308 to fulfill a LITR requirement*))

+W: Students transferring in with 48 or more credits are waived from these general education requirements.

At least three (3) courses in the major must be at the 300-level.
