Academic Challenges	 communicate with your instructors & advisors request an incomplete (<i>if eligible</i>) 	 ask for help, deadline extension, extra support/resources know the Academic Calendar
	 or withdraw by the stated deadline use a "Repeat Course" option 	 complete and submit a Repeat Course form
	appeal a course grade	 document your academic performance – organize all records that support your grade appeal and submit by deadline (see Academic Calendar)
	 appeal academic suspension or dismissal 	 regularly read your Ramapo email; submit your appeal by deadline



ISSUE	RIGHTS	RESPONSIBILITIES
Academic Integrity	 attend an Academic Integrity Hearing with the Vice Provost or with the Academic Integrity Board if reported for a violation (plagiarism, cheating, academic misconduct, fabrication) 	 do not violate the Academic Integrity Policy – uphold academic integrity

Definitions - Academic Integrity Honesty & Integrity!



- 1. Cheating a student misrepresents their mastery of material on a homework assignment, paper, test, or other exercise; ex: using unauthorized materials during an exam
- 2. Plagiarism the writer or speaker does not cite the source of words, phrases, sentences, data, or even ideas that should be attributed to/belonged to an original author, speaker, thinker, etc.; also note "self-plagiarism" in the Policy
- 3. Academic Misconduct someone behaves in a way that is academically dishonest; e.g., altering grades, acquiring or distributing an unadministered test, submitting the same work in more than one class without both instructors' awareness
- 4. Fabrication someone uses invented information or falsifies research, data, findings, etc.; e.g., including sources in a "works cited page" that were not actually used, forging signatures on forms, submitting work that was done by someone else
